## PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Lent is behind us and we are now in the middle of the Easter Season, which lasts seven weeks. A full week of Sundays is set aside to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord. We have gone from a time of introspection and reflection, examining our need for God's forgiveness, to celebrating the great gift of forgiveness and Jesus' conquering of death. We have moved from a season of weekly celebration of Holy Communion to the standard practice of dining at the Lord's Table twice a month.

I find the transition from weekly to twice-monthly Communion to be a difficult transition for several reasons. I enjoy the opportunity to dining with Jesus on a weekly basis. The recently completed Wednesday night Lenten Series illustrated a number of ways The Lords' Supper can be understood. The meal can be life-giving fruit from the Tree of the Cross. It is also understood as new Mana, a new bread from Heaven. The meal is medicine to heal the sin-sick soul. It is a time of fellowship with each other and a means of joining with the Heavenly Host. Eating with our Lord provides a time of rest and renewal, food to continue our faith journey. It is also a foretaste of the marriage feast between Jesus and His Church, a feast that has no end. I miss not getting to experience this meal on a regular basis.

Another reason I find the transition from weekly to twice-monthly Communion difficult is when we make the switch. We have weekly Communion during the Seasons of Advent and Lent.

While these are important seasons in the Church Year, they are not primary; they are seasons of preparation. The "white" days, the Festivals of Christmas and Easter, along with the Sundays of Transfiguration, Trinity, All Saints and Christ the King are the major holidays in the calendar. When these major Festivals arrive, we do not celebrate the festive time with weekly Communion, we return to a twice-monthly observance of this precious meal. We return to our monthly fast of not communing weekly precisely at the time when the church calendar encourages a weekly feast!

Martin Luther's Large Catechism, one of the Confessional documents in the Book of Concord (foundational documents of the Lutheran Church) contains the following:

"On this account it is indeed called a food of souls, which nourishes and strengthens the new man. For by baptism we are first born anew, but as we said before, there still remains the old vicious nature of flesh and blood in mankind. There are so many hindrances and temptations of the devil and of the world that we often become weary and faint, and

# Soup Kitchen Coordinator needed

Every other month, Peace Lutheran Church takes a turn preparing and serving a meal at the Soup Kitchen of Benton Harbor. For the past five years, the meals have been under the supervision of Soup Kitchen Coordinator Pat Nose.

After her five years at the helm, Pat feels it's time for her to step down. So, the church council is looking for a new coordinator.

The Soup Kitchen Coordinator plans the meal Peace will serve and then makes sure the team has the food they need.

Under Pat's leadership, the meals have ranged from spaghetti to pork chops to hot dogs. On Good Friday, April 14, volunteers from Peace Lutheran

Church served a turkey dinner complete with mashed potatoes, stuffing, brown sugar glazed carrots and pumpkin ice cream to 121 adults and six children. It may have been the only meal many of the Soup Kitchen patrons ate that day.

The Soup Kitchen team will remain intact and Pat is willing to help train the new person. She has tentative meals planned for the rest of the year, but said her replacement can choose what they want to make.

sometimes we stumble. Therefore, the sacrament is given as a daily pasture and sustenance, that faith may refresh and strengthen itself so that it will not fall back in such a battle, but become ever stronger and

stronger." (Article V 23-24)

Our foundational documents encourage a daily participation in the Lord's Supper. If we are not yet ready or able to move to a weekly observance of this Sacrament, perhaps we can shift our practice to one of feasting during the festive seasons of the Church year. Please share your thoughts with me.

## Funeral Dinner Coordinator needed

The search is underway for a Funeral Dinner Coordinator to oversee meals for the families when a loved one dies. Peace uses Hardings' Catering for funeral dinners. The coordinator works with the family to determine their needs, and then places the catering order.

The coordinator also finds volunteers to help with the luncheon and oversees setup, serving and cleanup for the actual meal.

Council President Kevin Kunst says he is concerned that if someone does not step up, the church will no longer be able to offer this service to grieving families.



## Seminary Month for the NALC

The Executive Council of the NALC has designated May to be "Seminary Month." Peace Lutheran Church's Church Council has designated Sunday, May 14 to collect a special offering to support our fledgling seminary.

# What Does This Mean to Me?

*This regular newsletter feature—playing on Luther’s famous line in the Small Catechism—is designed to help us all better understand why things happen as they do at Peace. There has been much confusion the past couple of years as different pastors introduced different worship practices. The worship committee actively seeks feedback or questions from congregation members confused or concerned about worship practices. This portion of the newsletter will share an issue raised at the worship committee and provide an answer for the congregation. Often when one person raises a question, others have similar thoughts but do not want to ask the question.*

## **“What is that tall candle by the baptismal font and why isn’t it lit every Sunday?”**

The tall candle is the Paschal Candle (from Pascha or Easter). It is typically a massive candle, at least 2 inches in diameter and 3 or 4 feet in length. It is used during the Easter season to show the presence of the

risen Christ among his people. It is also used at baptisms and funerals as a sign of dying and rising with Christ; of our death and his life.

The Paschal Candle is lit during the Easter Season and can be placed next to the altar, between the altar and the pulpit.

Depending on local custom, the candle is either lit for the first six weeks of the Easter Season and extinguished on Ascension Thursday or it remains lit for all seven weeks of Easter and is extinguished after the celebration of Pentecost.

The candle is lit for all baptisms, and it is from the flame of the Paschal Candle that the taper is lit and given to the newly baptized.

The paschal candle is moved into the Nave (Sanctuary) portion of the church building for funerals and is placed at the head of the casket to remind worshipers of the new life we have in Christ.

## Altar Guild Training

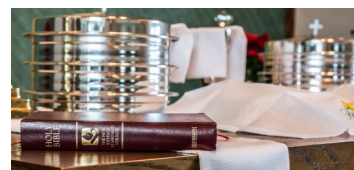
Have you ever wondered about the place settings on the Lord’s Table?

Would you like to learn about how to prepare the Table for a meal?

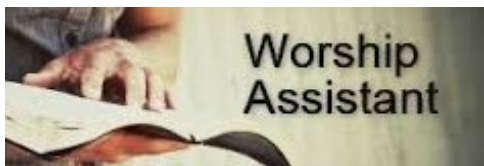
Are you unsure of how to handle the serving vessels?

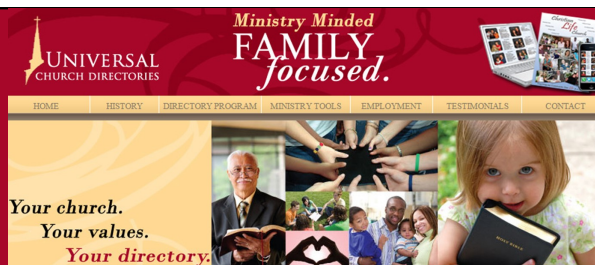
