Dear Members of Peace Lutheran Church.

We have entered the season of Lent. Lent is has become the new a time of preparation for Holy Week and Easter, as we remember the suffering, death and resurrection of our Savior. Jesus Christ. The name Lent comes from an Old English Word, which means "spring." Originally Lent was a period of fasting and penitence to cover the 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter not counting Sundays. Because it was a period of fasting, the tradition of giving something up for Lent originated.

The period of Lent probably originated from the 40 day period Jesus spent in the wilderness, led there by the Holy Spirit to be tempted by the devil. Jesus had to face Satan, the god of this world, in order to redeem us. He had to succeed where Adam failed.

If Christ could triumph over Satan, then He could begin His ministry to announce the Kingdom of God and finally to pay for the

iniquity of the human race with His life. Jesus Adam, or as the Bible calls him, the Last Adam, representing the human race before God. Being the only begotten Son of God. the human race has a wonderful representative in the courts of heaven.


